

# *Photis macinerneyi*

## Diagnostic Characters:

### Male:

G1, article 5 shorter than article 6, posterior margin narrow and produced (lobate); article 6 distinctly concave, defining corner acute or quadrate; palm concave or sinuous

G2, article 6 elongate (two times longer than wide), palmar tooth squared; inner margin of the dactyl sinuous or notched, but lacking a tooth or medial swelling; palm transverse

Head with distinct anterior and posterior pigment patches dorsally

P4, article 4 and 5 slender

### Female:

G1, article 5 shorter than article 6; posterior margin one-third anterior margin

Body with numerous pigment spots

Head with distinct anterior and posterior pigment patches dorsally

Coxa 1 not produced and without fan of setae

G1 convex

G1 and G2, defining spine ordinary

Antenna 1, peduncular article 1 long, exceeding eye lobe by one-half its length

Eye lobe blunt, triangular

Coxa 2 through 4 normal, not long and strap-like

Coxa 5 not large and triangular

G2, palm without palmar tooth, or defining tooth

P4, article 4 and 5 slender
