Important Characters:

The head of this Aglaja is short with lateral lobes. The tails are long conspicuous and equal to unequal in length. The body color is brown-black with yellow and white spots. A white mark is usually found on the lateral head lobe. Very similar in general appearance to Diomede's aglajid.

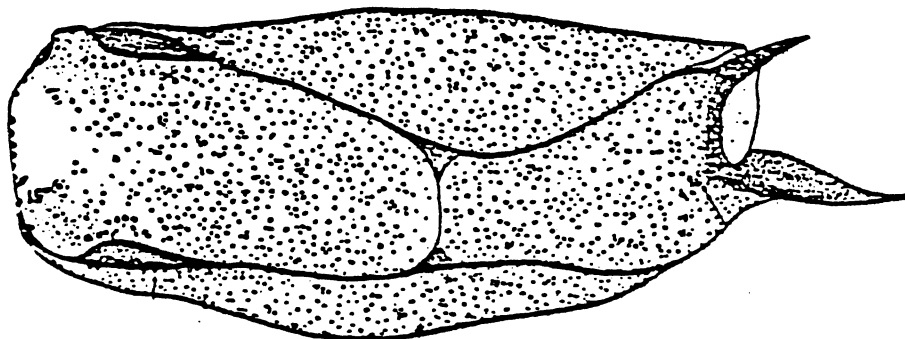
Size: To 20 mm.
