1. Notosetae from second branchial segment; continue almost to pygidium.

- Uncini from setiger 2; absent from extreme end of body.
- Uncini in flattened rings (Fig. 1) after setiger 5; gradually return to single rows posteriorly.
- 4. Branchiae 3 pairs, each with many slender filaments.

RELATED SPECIES AND DIFFERENCES:

Thelepus hamatus: branchiae 2 pairs

Thelepus "setosus" complex: thoracic uncini occur in straight rows.
