Dyopedos monocanthus

Diagnostic Characters:

- Eyes large
- Antennae shorter than body
- Coxa 1 in male developed into a long tooth
- Coxa 2 with small tooth at anteroventral corner
- Coxa 3 and Coxa 4 are bluntly pointed
- Coxa of female small and without spines
- Male G2 has cleaved propodus leaving bifid appearance




Fig. 15. Dyopedos monacanthus. A, lateral view; B, dorsal view head; C and D, 9 gnathopods 1 and 2; E-G, percopods 5-7; H, anterior of 3; I, 3 gnathopod 2 propodus; J, maxilliped; K and L, maxilla 2 and 1; M and N, upper and lower lip; O and P, left and right mandible; Q, posterior urosome.
