Bathymedon vulpeculus

Diagnostic Characters:

- Rostrum long, reaching more than half way along article 1 of antenna 1, and exceeding lateral cephalic lobe.
- Rostrum slender, tapering to an acute point
- Eye absent
- G2, article 5 one-third longer than article 6
- G2 palm longer than hind margin of article 6
- Body densely covered with very minute, broadly triangular, ragged scales giving fuzzy appearance
- Telson rounded or truncate but with only setae present, no spines




FIGURE 28.—Bathymedon vulpeculus, new species, holotype, male, 4.8 mm, Oregon 25.
