Photis brevipes

Diagnostic Characters:

Male:

G2, dactyl with blunt median tooth and large, distally upturned palmar tooth

Antenna 2, article 3 strongly geniculate(bent downward)

Distinct pigment spot present on coxa 5 and antero-distal margin of G1, article 6, just below dactyl G1, article 5 subequal to article 6

G2, palm transverse

P4, articles 4 and 5 normal, slender

Female:

G2, scarcely oblique, palm nearly vertical, weakly excavate, its margin sinuous, the defining corner acutely produced

Antenna 2, article 3 strongly geniculate (turned down)

Distinct pigment spot present on coxa 5 and antero-distal margin of G1, article 6, just below dactyl G2, article 2 strongly produced antero-distally

Coxae 1-5 densely setose

G1, palm convex, flat or scarcely sinuous

Eye normal

G2, palm without defining tooth

P4, articles 4 and 5 normal, slender
