- Important Characters: The epistome is highly characteristic; long and pointy (base thickness may be slightly variable) and highly visible. Seven small, even teeth are on pereaopod 5 and the rostrum is spatulate.
- Related Species and Character Differences: Differs from R. abronius by having a broader rostrum; smaller teeth on peraeopod 5, and the presence of a large apical spine on the peduncle of uropod 1.
