Gracilipleustes monocuspis

Diagnostic Characters:

- Gnathopods often strongly subchelate, rarely subequal (2 larger, often of different form
- Carpus of G2 not elongate, deep
- Palm of propod (G2) with median tooth
- Apex of telson entire
- Coxal gill possibly present on P7
- Dactyl slender, non-pectinate or weak or lacking
- Pleon plate 3 often rounded and or serrated
- Telson keeled centrally, often cleft or notched apically
- Rostrum small, shorter than width of eye
- Pleon plate 2 with dorsal posterior tooth
