Primary Diagnostic Characters: Small (to 20mm); elongate, more so than in Tellina modesta; moderately inflated,

somewhat more so than in <u>T</u>. modesta; almost equilateral to longer anteriorly; rounded anteriorly; characterized by its pink color with some specimens

showing white rays.

Variability:

This species may have two forms in southern California, a large, flat, light-colored, offshore one and a smaller, more inflated, more brightly colored one in bays (Coan, 1971).





Figure 6 Tellina carpenteri, internal view of valves from Coan 1971
